The world chooses Biden over Trump


Only four out of 21 countries choose Trump over Biden.

Huge gap between Republicans and Democrats

65% of Republicans believe the 2020 election was rigged.

The majority says Trump should not be the Republican candidate if convicted and imprisoned

57% of Republicans think Donald Trump should run anyway

Trump could lose 11% of the votes if he is found guilty and imprisoned




The world will be watching the 2024 election very closely.
